



What a great weekend for the North wrestlers. Four went to Hershey and 3 placed. What an outstanding performance. Not only that, those 4 accumulated enough team points to boost Council Rock North into 8th place overall out of the field of the 134 schools competing in this year's State tournament.

Kyle Hauserman (106) lost to Mason Prinkey from Connellsville in his opener by a 4-6 sv in overtime but he came back and won 5 in a row to finish in 3rd place in the state. In all 5 of his consolation matches **Kyle** only allowed his opponents a total of 2 points. He had two 7-0 shutouts, 2 pins and a 6-2 decision win in the finals. **Kyle** avenged his loss to Prinkey by shutting him out in the consolation semifinals. That had to feel good. This was **Kyle's** second trip to Hershey. Last year he made the trip as a freshman and did not place. This year a different story and he will surely be in the mix next year. **Kyle** finished the year with a 42-6 record and an overall record of 81-15. He is ranked 1st in the District with two Sectional titles, one District and Regional title and a 3rd at States and he still has two more years to go.

Luke Lucerne (120) started off with an 8-1 decision win over Logan Seliga from Belle Vernon. He followed with a decision over Manheim Central's Will Betancourt. A 3-1 loss to Sean Pierson from Nazareth moved **Luke** to the consolations. In the consi semifinals he outscored Stroudsburg's Cameron Enriquez 6-4 to advance to the finals where he met up with his old nemesis Shane Hanson-Ashworth. This will be the third time these two have met this year. The first two went to Hanson-Ashworth by decisions. This one was a tough fought battle but **Luke** came out on the short end of the 1-3 in overtime decision to finish in 4th place. **Luke** finishes the year with a 35-10 record and a career mark of 104-29. He is ranked 3rd in the District with 2 Sectional title and a District title. **Luke** is three time Penn Manor Comet Classic Tournament Champion. He placed 6th at States in 2017 and 4th here in 2019.

This was **Cameron Robinson** (145) third trip to Hershey. As a freshman he won one and lost two. In 2018 **Cameron** placed 5th as a sophomore. This year he made it to the finals with wins over Stefanik from Nazareth, Connor from Wilson (West Lawn) and Erie Cathedral Prep's Paniro Johnson. In the finals he lost 2-3 to Ryan Anderson the returning State Champion from Bethlehem Catholic to finish 2nd in the State. **Cameron** finishes the year with a record of 35-5 and an overall record of 109-23. He is ranked 1st in District One with 2 Sectional titles, 2 District titles and 2 regional titles, 5th as a sophomore and 2nd as a junior.

Dillon Sheehy (152) lost 4-5 to Colby Romjue from Susquehannock in his opening match. He moved to the consolations where he lost to Northampton's Michael Kistler in the 2nd Round and was eliminated. This was **Dillon's** 2nd trip to States. Last year he finished 1-2 and didn't place. He is sure to make it back again next year and hopefully the third trip will be the charm. **Dillon** finished the year with a 34-11 record and a career record of 87-35. He is ranked 4th in District One with 1 Sectional title, 1 District title and 1 Regional title.

North had a pretty good year with a 3-3 record in the Suburban One National Conference and an 8-9 overall record. They finished 3rd in the Bear duals, 8th at the Penn Manor Comet Classic, 22nd at Powerade, 2nd at the Rockyard duals, 16th at Escape the Rock, 4th at the SOL Championships, 4th at District One East, 2nd at the South East Regionals and 8th in the State. Not bad and this was a really young team with no seniors. Next year should even be better. See you then.
